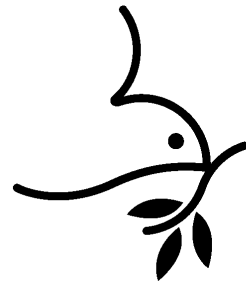


at 202-328-0072. The Spring 2010 semester will run each Tuesday night from 7-8:30 p.m. from April 27-June 15th.
