A Note on the Sermon

For the last few months, I have been chewing on the words of two great poets, Langston Hughes and Rumi. Each poet cried out to the world to listen, listen to the brokenhearted, the outcast, the marginal, and even greater, the Spirit. Hughes saw a world of great racial injustice and inequality; Rumi entered a spiritually disconnected world full of war and strife. We don't have to go as far back a Jonah to see and understand God's call. As I have journeyed with Jonah, more and more have I come to understand this call is less about how good I am or my qualifications, for those things will come; rather this is a call about being in the right place at the right time.

As a Trans, queer, young adult of color, this is an interesting time to be a part of the Mennonite Church. Hyattsville has been gifted to a world full of marginalization, oppression, and discrimination. Much like Hughes and Rumi, Hyattsville has been crying out to Allegheny Conference and to our denomination to listen, to care, to celebrate. We have been placed in this context for such a time as this. We have cried, we have laughed. We have felt the sting of injustice and persecution from the places we have once called home. In Hughes poem, "I Dream a World," he says, "I dream a world black or white whatever race you be, will share the bounties of the earth and every man is free." For Hyattsville, "We dream of a world when all gifts are celebrated no matter race, creed, socioeconomic status, gender identity or sexual orientation." "Where every man is free" anchored Langston; God's abundant gifts in and through humanity anchor us today.

What happened to Jonah's dream for Nineveh? Did God give a dream, or did Jonah just not listen? I invite you to enter into Jonah's story anew with fresh eyes, ready to dream. What would Jonah's call be like if he'd paid attention to the dream? Acted on the dream? What would your call be like if you don't stop dreaming? Continue to dream? Begin to dream? This community is ready for your dreams. This community is ready to hear, listen, and encourage. I believe that God's Kingdom is a dream we are constantly making a reality. Let's dream together.
