Days of Prayer & Action (DOPA) for Colombia: On May 17 and 18, Christian Peacemaker Teams (CPT) and partner organizations invite you to join them in prayer for peace in Colombia on Sunday, May 17. On Monday, May 18, you're invited to take action, calling for an end to the conflict and human rights abuses in Colombia. Although the Colombian government has now been in negotiations with the largest guerrilla group, the FARC, in Havana, Cuba for over two years now, Colombian civilians continue to bear the consequences of the war. Last year alone, more than 600 human rights defenders were attacked, including 55 assassinations, and hundreds more were threatened in early 2015. We will observe DOPA next Sunday, May 17 when Boris Ozuna brings us the message and our sister church group leads worship.
