

**MVS Coordinator Position:** The Washington, DC Mennonite Voluntary Service Unit (MVS) is seeking a Local Program Coordinator (LPC) for the unit based in the Columbia Heights neighborhood. Primary responsibilities include facilitating job placements for the volunteers, providing a nurturing and supportive structure for community living and maintaining communication with the national MVS administrators, MVS Support Committee members, and agencies employing the volunteers. Qualifications include the ability to adapt to varying needs and personalities of MVSers, flexibility, good communication skills, the ability to take initiative with minimal supervision, and good organizational and administrative skills. This is a part-time, contractual position with an average of 15 hours per week. Hours are flexible, include some evenings and weekends, and can be highly variable depending on the time of year. Mid-August through September tends to be the busiest time of year. Compensation will be commensurate with experience. Start date is ideally mid-June to beginning of July.
