



Lent 2017 - Psalm 23 – An Invitation to Interaction

During this season of Lent here at Hyattsville, we are using Psalm 23 as a theme scripture. Each week Psalm 23 is being incorporated in a variety of ways in our worship. The worship committee would also like to extend an invitation to each of us to interact with Psalm 23 as individuals.

There are three options for interaction:

Memorization – everyone is encouraged to memorize Psalm 23. There are many versions of the Psalm available. The King James translation is perhaps the most well-known and quoted version, however, there are lots of translations to choose from. The one the back of this sheet is an inclusive language version for you to consider and several others were attached to the listserv announcements. Many more are available via the internet or by contacting Michelle.

Write Your Own – another option, suggested by an HMC small group, is to spend time reflecting on the 23rd Psalm and then writing your own version as a reflection of what you hear and experience within the original text. The BMC Anniversary 23rd Psalm attached to the listserv announcements is a great example of re-working the original text in a fresh and meaningful way.

Creative Response – finally, you might consider a creative response to the 23rd Psalm. Perhaps you like to draw, paint, or make collages – what might the 23rd Psalm look like visually? Maybe you are a singer or musician – what sounds evoke to the 23rd Psalm – or what sounds does the psalm invoke? Maybe you are a movement artist – what might it feel like to embody the 23rd Psalm in movement?

How you choose to respond to this invitation is up to you. We encourage you to select one way you will engage with the 23rd Psalm as an individual or with your household in the weeks ahead. May the adventure of interaction be an experience of unexpected restoration.

Psalm 23 - First Egalitarian Translation

God, you are my shepherd –
I want nothing more.
You let me lie down in green meadows;
you lead me beside restful waters:
you refresh my soul.
You guide me to lush pastures
for the sake of your Name.
Even if I'm surrounded by shadows of Death,
I fear no danger, for you are with me.
Your rod and your staff –
they give me courage.
You spread a table for me
in the presence of my enemies,
and you anoint my head with oil –
my cup overflows!
Only goodness and love will follow me
all the days of my life,
and I will dwell in your house, YHWH,
for days without end.
