

**Lent Offering:** This year's Lenten offering will benefit refugee families. **Worship Arts for Lent:** During Lent, we are exploring the theme of covenant. Covenant is about relationship: relationship between God and humans, and human to human as we share God's love with each other. In scripture, people encounter God's presence and sometimes pile rocks together as an ebenezer, a pillar or marker of the moment and place where God was met. The Lenten banners represent an ebenezer. During Lent, we are invited to reflect on encounters with God in our own lives and be on the lookout for God each day.

**Maundy Thursday:** All are welcome to the Maundy Thursday service on March 29 at 7:00 p.m. for a simple meal of soup and bread. You may participate in foot washing, Communion, a tenebrae service, and nailing confessions to the cross. Please RSVP to Jake Short by March 27, and indicate if you will need child care.

**Good Friday:** On Good Friday, March 30, three HMC families will host a shared reading of the Passion scriptures with Communion at 7:30 p.m. Please RSVP to the Reedys (NE DC) [REDACTED] Meryt McGindley (Hyattsville, MD) [REDACTED] or the Fretz-Goerings (north Silver Spring, MD) [REDACTED] to let them know if you will attend.
