Advent & Christmas Announcements

Advent Worship Arts: The worship visuals during this Advent season focus on the theme of *nurture in the journey* as chosen by HMC Council and Pastorate for the year. The journeys of Mary and Joseph, and the wise ones are familiar to us. We are conscious of the many people who undertake perilous journeys to escape danger, such as the caravan of migrants from Central America. Some journeys are physical or geographical in nature; some encompass a route to spiritual change or transformational justice. What visually represents nurture in such journeys? The cloth draped from the arched support beams conveys the shelter of a tent over our heads as we gather together, providing a nurturing space for reflection and support. The banners express a night sky thick with stars, which in the ever-darkening days of mid-winter in the northern hemisphere, might provide illumination, inspiration or direction.

Advent/Christmas Offering: Our Advent/Christmas offering will go to our work with DMV Sanctuary Congregation Network, an interfaith network of congregations in the DC/MD/VA region that provides support and solidarity to neighbors, friends, and family who fear being detained, deported or profiled. In the face of hate and discrimination, our faith calls us to show love, compassion and hospitality. A primary focus for the Network is Deportation Defense. This includes advocacy, community organizing, fundraising, family support, media outreach and communications. Network members accompany people to ICE check-ins, legal hearings and congressional visits; hold Defend Your Rights trainings; host people who are at risk of deportation; support congregations that are hosting; and press cities and states to get ICE out of schools, jails and courts and to end all policies that racially profile and over-incarcerate people of color. As an active member of the Network, HMC has already contributed significant time and energy to these activities. We are also called on to raise financial support for the Network's activities. **HMC has a goal of raising \$5,000 through our Advent offering to support this work.** The DMV Sanctuary Congregation Network needs to raise an additional \$50,000 in the next two months to hire one more part-time organizer. Thus, besides our congregational offering, we also invite anyone who may be interested in this cause to reach out to your personal networks to invite them to donate via an online giving platform here: <https://give.faithinaction.org/team/DMV>. Christmas Pageant December 16: This year we will hold our impromptu pageant on December 16th instead of waiting till Epiphany! While no rehearsal will be required, any kids and youth who are able to come early to

church will gather in the sanctuary to get a sense of how the story will flow and may be given specific roles. The pageant will take place that morning during the worship service. Fear not! If you can't make it to the Sunday school time gathering, you can still participate in the pageant during worship!

Christmas Eve Service: On December 24 at 5:00 p.m., we will hold our annual Christmas Eve service of lessons and carols! This service is full of music and Scripture as we gather together to celebrate the birth of Christ. Contact Michelle Burkholder if you wish to participate in the service.

Sunday School for All Ages in December: Sunday School in December will not be held at UPCoB. A traditional Sunday School class will be offered for the 2/3s in the nursery at HMC. For children and youth:

- Dec. 9 at 9:30 a.m. in the HMC foyer, ages 4+ will have a gathering time followed by craft tables to make Christmas ornaments together.
- Dec. 16 at 9:30 a.m. in the HMC sanctuary, ages 4+ will have a gathering time & Christmas Pageant preparation (see separate announcement).
- Dec. 23 at 10:00 a.m. in the HMC Fellowship Hall, all ages are welcome to participate in Carols and Treats. Does your family have a favorite seasonal carol you like to sing? Do you know carols from other cultures/in languages other than English? Bring along some holiday treats (sweet or salty welcome) to share and your favorite carols to sing together before worship; there will also be a hot cocoa and toppings bar!
- Dec. 30 at 10:00 a.m. in the HMC Fellowship Hall, all ages are welcome to gather for a time of informal fellowship and treats before church.

For Adult Education, there will be two options: 1.) Cindy Lapp will lead a drop-in choir in some new pieces that could potentially land in the new hymnal. Those who attend will have the opportunity to sing at the Christmas Eve service, but it is not required. Location will be in the sanctuary on Dec. 9 and 23, and in the basement on Dec. 16. 2.) If singing isn't for you, come to an informal discussion group at the church house (6220 43rd Ave.). Please come with a favorite seasonal poem, song, story or anything really, to share and discuss as a group.
