We welcome Sarah Augustine as today's preacher: Sarah, who is a Pueblo (Tewa) descendant, is founder and cochair of the Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Coalition (2014) and the co-founder of Suriname Indigenous Health Fund (2004). She has represented the interests of Indigenous community partners to their own governments, the Inter-American development bank, the United Nations, the World Health Organization, and a host of other international actors including corporate interests. She employs shuttle diplomacy and community-based participatory action to de-escalate conflict and establish common ground between communities and external interests. She currently lives in Washington state with her husband and son.
