Masks Optional Starting Sept 11: The HMC Covid Task Force recommends that we make masks optional in worship and in the building beginning Sept 11. New Time for Sunday School: Both Sunday School and Adult Education will be starting at 9:45 a.m. going forward. Plans for Sunday School for kids and youth are still under construction. We will keep you informed as those pieces come together. On September 11, we'll kick off the new year of activities with a gathering for kids and youth of all ages in the church house yard (or the church house if weather is bad). Ages 4 and up welcome on their own, under 4 welcome with a trusted adult.

Adult Ed, Sept. 11: Our Adult Ed series begins on September 11 at 9:45 a.m. with a dive into Brian McLaren's latest book: "Do I Stay Christian? A Guide for the Doubters, the Disappointed, and the Disillusioned." The book takes an unflinching look at powerful questions that many people are asking -- sometimes only in private. McLaren urges us to think about, and discuss, these questions openly through a process of forming responsible, ethical decisions about our religious beliefs and identity. Discounted copies are available for purchase at the church for \$20. It is also available at bookstores, and as an ebook or audiobook.
