Confession

We uphold that diversity is God's blessed design and that followers of Jesus are called to be changemakers for justice but we do not always live that out.

We mourn our congregation's silent witness and complicity in racism in America. Too often we have failed to follow in the footsteps of Jesus and failed to walk in solidarity with Black, Brown, Indigenous, and other people of color who are marginalized.

We acknowledge that our predominantly white congregation has benefited from generations of slave and immigrant labor as well as policies and customs that prioritize and maintain the power of whiteness.

We acknowledge our congregation was part of the "white flight" from the District of Columbia, moving into a suburb with racial covenants and active segregationist policies. We often fail to challenge law enforcement and legal systems that imprison, deny citizenship, and provide unequal justice for poor and disenfranchised neighbors.
